We will talk about career pathways and career development options across these areas and we will have lots of time for Q&A.

In our final session you will hear from colleagues about working in our clinical healthcare support workforce. There are a range of rewarding roles assisting nurses, therapists, midwives, hospital doctors and other healthcare professionals in delivering high-quality, person-centred care.
