DG Works Eligibility



You must meet all of the following criteria:

- 16 years of age or older

- Resident in Dumfries and Galloway

- Have the right to work and live in the UK.

- Unemployed and looking to get back into work OR in employment and claiming an income-based benefit (e.g. Universal Credit)

DG Works Eligibility



AND at least one of the following characteristics:

- Parents with a child under the age of 19 (still registered in full time education)
- Armed Forces Veteran
- Asylum Seeker
- Care Experienced
- Caring responsibilities
- Childcare needs
- Criminal Convictions

- Homeless or affected by housing inclusion.
- Long Term health condition/ illness
- No / Limited work experience
- Refugee
- Substance related conditions
- Lack of Transport

Employment Key Workers (EKW)



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Employment Key Workers offer 1-2-1 and group work support to individuals looking to move into positive destinations (employment, FE/HE, training).

Participants are given a dedicated Key Worker who works with them identify their goals, plan their next steps and access further employability support with partner agencies.

Participants will also be supported to create CVs, job search, better understand job applications and how to apply, learn interview techniques and preparation, access work experience placements.

DFN Project SEARCH



The DFN Project SEARCH programme provides real work experience combined with training in employability and independent living skills delivered in a business setting to help young people make successful transitions to productive adult life.

It is a partnership between a **Employability and Skills Service**, **Dumfries and Galloway College**, and **Dumfries and Galloway Council**. The goal is to provide full/part -time paid work for our interns in an integrated setting.

Applications via the college website open in March 2025.



Eligibility Young people with a learning disability or autism spectrum conditions, or both.

Placement Plus



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Placement Plus is a 6-month paid placement within Dumfries and Galloway Council, designed to support people with disabilities to get into work.

Clients will be supported by a designated Employability and Skills Service (ESS) Keyworker to ensure barrier removal and reasonable adjustments are in place within the internal organization to allow clients to thrive and gain experience.

Training opportunities are also available to develop and enhance skill sets.

Participant Discretionary Funding





Participant Discretionary Funding is available to anyone registered with DG Works. It covers relevant costs to help participants progress on the employability pathway. Needs should be identified within the client's needs assessment and are costs which cannot be covered by other funding sources.

Participant Driving Lessons



Participant Driving Lessons can be provided to clients who meet the following criteria:

- Registered with DG Works
- Actively engaging with employability support in a consistent manner
- And where not being able to drive is their last remaining barrier to work or if driving would be required for their career choice.

Funding may be provided for up to 20 driving lessons. If participants require to pass their theory test, then 10 lessons will initially be provided until completion of a theory test, with 10 lessons thereafter.

To apply for funding for a client requests must be made in writing and provide a clear justification for the spend.

Please note requests can be denied and therefore please seek approval before spending money.

Participant Travel Support





As part of a participants employability journey, we realise that individuals may face travel costs to help them engage with the support available on the DG Works pathway. Participant Travel Support provides pre-paid bus passes to enable participants to engage with employability support such as appointments, training and work placements.

- Actively engaging with employability support in a consistent manner

Participant Clothing Support



- DG Works recognise that for people receiving employability support, progression into a positive destination can come at a financial cost. Previously this type of support was provided on a 121 basis, however, to remove any stigma or reluctance to ask for support a £150 Love2Shop online clothing voucher is now issued to participants on confirmation of employment, training or further education.
- Once an outcome is recorded on Hanlon the client will be automatically sent a Love2Shop voucher.
- Note: this is attached a limited budget, so this funding is not guaranteed.

No One Left Behind College Fee Waiver



DG Works are proud to be working in partnership with DG College to offer eligible participants the opportunity develop new work-related skills.

Participants can build the skills they need to move towards, into and within employment or undertake some training to progress their career to the next level.

Cost for chargeable course are covered once a client is registered with DG Works and the course is approved. Participants can only access one course within a 12-month period.

Please note requests may not be approved - no activity should be started until final approval has been awarded.

Multiply





Multiply is a free maths tuition programme designed to address the needs of people identified in the 10 interventions identified by the UK Government which has been "translated", locally, into:

- students being able to register for free on-line courses or attendance at a real-world class, in one of the region's towns
- learning for parents in how to teach their kids maths through everyday activities, play and outdoor learning
- courses using real-world skills like cooking and managing shopping costs •
- courses designed to help with budgeting and debt management •
- courses deigned to help students get a basic Functional Maths qualification
- courses deigned to help students get a recognised maths qualification, up to Level 5, if they want to.

Eligibility

Anybody over the age of 16 who is, or is at danger of becoming, NEET. Otherwise, anybody over the age of 19 in Scotland who wants to improve their ability to do maths.

Engagement and Barrier Removal Support for Parents

Delivered by: Right Options and Let's Get Sporty





Right Options and Let's Get Sporty offer support to parents in the region to begin their engagement with the employability pathway.

Support is provided by a dedicated keyworker in the organisation who focuses on building a relationship with the participant to complete a personalised needs assessment and develop follow-on plans and engage support from other services. Time is taken with the parents who, due to circumstances, lack the knowledge, awareness or confidence may be unclear of the support they need.

Once the participant is ready, they will progress to being supported by an Employment Key Worker.

Enterprise Support CEIS (locations to be confirmed)





Designed for those who are considering self-employment the programmes are delivered over 6 weeks. They are designed to inspire and give confidence as well as practical knowledge and skills to embark on self-employment or social enterprise.

The 6 weeks will be delivered largely online, with some in-person learning. The in-person portion will be facilitated peer-to-peer learning through collaborative discussions and problem-solving exercises. On completion of the programme, referrals will be made for parents to have continued support from partners, such as Business Gateway or South Of Scotland Enterprise.

Start dates for these programmes TBC.

Whole Family Approach Wigtownshire and Stewartry Partnership





DG Works is working with Wigtownshire and Stewartry Partnership to deliver a 'Whole Family Approach' across Wigtownshire to develop employability provision for disabled parents and parents of disabled children who have a level of unmet need.

The aim is to:

- Address the needs of the families (physical, mental, emotional, cognitive, financial).
- Signpost existing support services within the family's local community and support families attending these.
- Work with family members to address 'barriers' that prevent parents and young people from entering a positive destination. ٠
- Remove 'barriers' by working collaboratively with stakeholders. ٠
- Utilise the services available on a wider, local, community level. ٠
- Transform household income and overall wellbeing. ٠

By providing tailored support to all members in the household, the programme aims to enhance employability and job readiness. Sessions will be delivered in a friendly, nurturing approach in a safe, local space or in the comfort of the family's home.

Participant Condition Management FedCap





FedCap are delivering a Condition Management Service for participants requiring support to move into or sustain work.

Clients are provided with an initial Health Triage and biopsychosocial assessment will identify primary health needs, leading to the development of health action plan. Following this each participant will have access to a range of one-to-one and group workshops provided through inperson, virtual and telephone support alongside a case management approach incorporating practical problem-solving information, techniques, coaching and support.

Participants will then be provided with personalised support and an action plan.

Supported Employment



Support will include:

 Vocational profiling (to determine aspirations, learning needs, skills, experiences, job preferences. Undertaking support and training with barrier resolution, personal development, locating skills, CV creation and job specific update, practical job search

- Employer engagement (preparation and undertaking employment related activity. May include work taster, meet and match employers, interview preparation including simulated interviews)
- Job matching (develop aspirational and realistic expectations, support with job applications and reviewing job descriptions. Job carving to suite the individual and employer's needs). Looking at funding available to support employers for adjustments required, including eligibility for ERI funding.
- Better off in work calculations can be provided as part of goal setting
- In-work support and career development (on and off the job support, rapid response to issues encouraging the employer and co-workers e.g. via workplace mentoring and buddy systems. Acting as an intermediary between the participant and employer if there are any concerns.

Disability Engagement and Barrier Removal



Support areas depending on individual need may include:



- Identifying relevant community-based support groups which align with the participants interests and hobbies to increase confidence and reduce isolation
- Confidence building throughout the programme
- Motivation and changing mindset/resilience
- Coping with anxiety
- Life skills
- Basic digital skills
- Signposting to specialist support with warm handovers i.e. mental health, debit etc
- Goal setting
- Better off in work calculations can be provided as part of goal setting and motivation

Advancing Innovative Manufacturing in the South of Scotland (AIMS Project) Skills Support





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Our skills offer covers a range learning levels from introductory to certificated courses on the following themes:

- Computer Numerical Control (CNC) Turning and Milling
- Robotic and Manual Welding
- 3D Modelling, Printing, Scanning and Probing
- Collaborative Robots (Cobots)
- Virtual and Augmented Reality
- Computer programming

These are aimed not only at individuals with an interest in manufacturing and engineering (including digital manufacturing), but also those looking to try something new and develop some basic skills e.g. problem solving. We hope to inspire individuals to either embark on further vocational courses , assist them to gain entry onto other training and provide support to gain employment locally.
